

Guidelines on age limits for VR content usage

Location-based VR Association Inc.

When children under the age of 13 are to use location-based VR content using a binocular stereoscope, gain the consent of the children's parents about the following and have the children use the VR content on the parents' own responsibility.

[Precautions]

- Do not have children under the age of seven use VR content.
- Do not have children use VR content that parents consider not appropriate for children.
- Make sure that children take a 10 to 15 minute break after using VR content for 20 minutes continuously.
- If a child has a strabismus, double vision or any other eyesight problem or ophthalmic disease or if a child is visiting an eye doctor, consult a specialist physician about the usage.
- If a child develops an eyesight problem after using VR content, immediately consult with a medical specialist.

Usage of these guidelines (to location operators)

- Post these guidelines in plain view of visitors. When there is a request that a child under the age of 13 wants to use VR content, be sure to inform the parents of the precautions and gain their consent.
- These guidelines do not include precautions common to all ages. Use these guidelines in addition to the facility's own precautions.
- These guidelines apply to location-based VR content only and they do not apply to home use or any other type of VR content.
- These guidelines should be used on each operator's own responsibility.
- Additions and changes, if any, should be made to these guidelines on the operator's own responsibility.
- The latest version of these guidelines will be available on the website of Location-based VR Association Inc. Be sure to use the latest version of the guidelines.
- These guidelines are self-imposed regulations based on the latest information of the current time and established upon examinations by experts. They are subject to change due to practical circumstances.
